	<p>develop an understanding of the importance of duty and commitment to many religions</p> <p>know that following dharma (religious duty) is an important part of Hindu life</p> <p>suggest the impact of belief in dharma, particularly the belief that there are three 'debts' – duty owed to God/the deities, duty owed to teachers, and duty owed to family</p>	<p>describe how and why Hindus might celebrate Raksha Bandhan</p> <p>identify aspects of the celebration which remind Hindus of their dharma</p> <p>identify religious teachings contained within a Hindu story – and suggest how these stories might be used to teach Hindu children about dharma (eg. What teachings about duty to family are expressed in the story of Rama and Sita?)</p>	<p>identify sources of authority and inspiration</p> <p>consider what our 'duties' as human beings are</p>	<p>reflect on their own duties – to themselves, to their families, to their communities</p> <p>discuss who or what they follow – and why</p>
